In 2025, midsize enterprise (MSE) CIOs must maximize the impact of small teams and budgets while playing a central role in business strategy, as technology becomes foundational to organizational success. With AI expectations rising, MSE CEOs are prioritizing cybersecurity and data quality, and many see current operating models as insufficient for an AI-driven world.

To meet these challenges, MSE CIOs should:

- Establish sound data security with data security governance
- Deliver reliable data with a data and analytics strategy and operating model (DASOM)
- Align with CEO operating model changes for AI success

MSE IT Leadership

MSE CIOs must balance diverse responsibilities — from security and risk management to digital strategy, infrastructure, data analytics and talent leadership.



MSE IT Organization Fundamentals

IT teams in MSEs are typically small and lack dedicated specialists. CIOs and IT staff often serve as "versatilists," handling a wide range of responsibilities beyond their titles.


MSEs often spend a higher percentage of revenue on IT, partly because they can't leverage scale.



Top 10 CEO Business Priorities

Although mentions of growth as a CEO priority have declined from last year, it remains the top focus, with technology as the second priority due to its role in driving growth initiatives.


MSE CEOs remain highly cost-conscious, but interest in top-line growth — especially sales revenue, capacity and geographic expansion — has increased.



AI Still Has the CEO's Attention

Al remains a top CEO priority; however, leaders now recognize the significant costs, risks and effort involved in Al deployment.

For MSE CIOs, this means a heightened focus on cybersecurity and risk management — 73% cite it as a top priority, reflecting board concerns about rising cyberthreats. Data readiness is also critical, with poor data quality seen as the main barrier to Al success.



MSE CEOs See a Link Between Cybersecurity and Business Growth



Data and Analytics Capabilities Are Critical for Growth


MSE CEOs now recognize that data management and integrity are essential for decision making and Al success, naming data analytics as the top technology for growth.



CIOs must stay current on security solutions, including managed services, to effectively safeguard their organizations.






Lack of Sound Data Inhibits AI Value

MSE CIOs must prioritize data curation and governance, involving the entire organization in data management.






Operating Model Issues Affect Business Outcomes



Success depends on organizationwide support for security policies, an area where MSEs' close-knit structures give CIOs a unique edge.






ACTIONS

Organizations must regularly assess their data ecosystem and capabilities, addressing gaps and building on strengths.





Align With CEO Operating Model Changes for Al Success


MSE CEOs understand their organizations must adapt operating models, workforce skills and foundational structures to compete in an Al-driven world.
